During the transition period, there will be no change to the materials you currently recycle or your recycling schedule. Learn more: circularmaterials.ca/ON

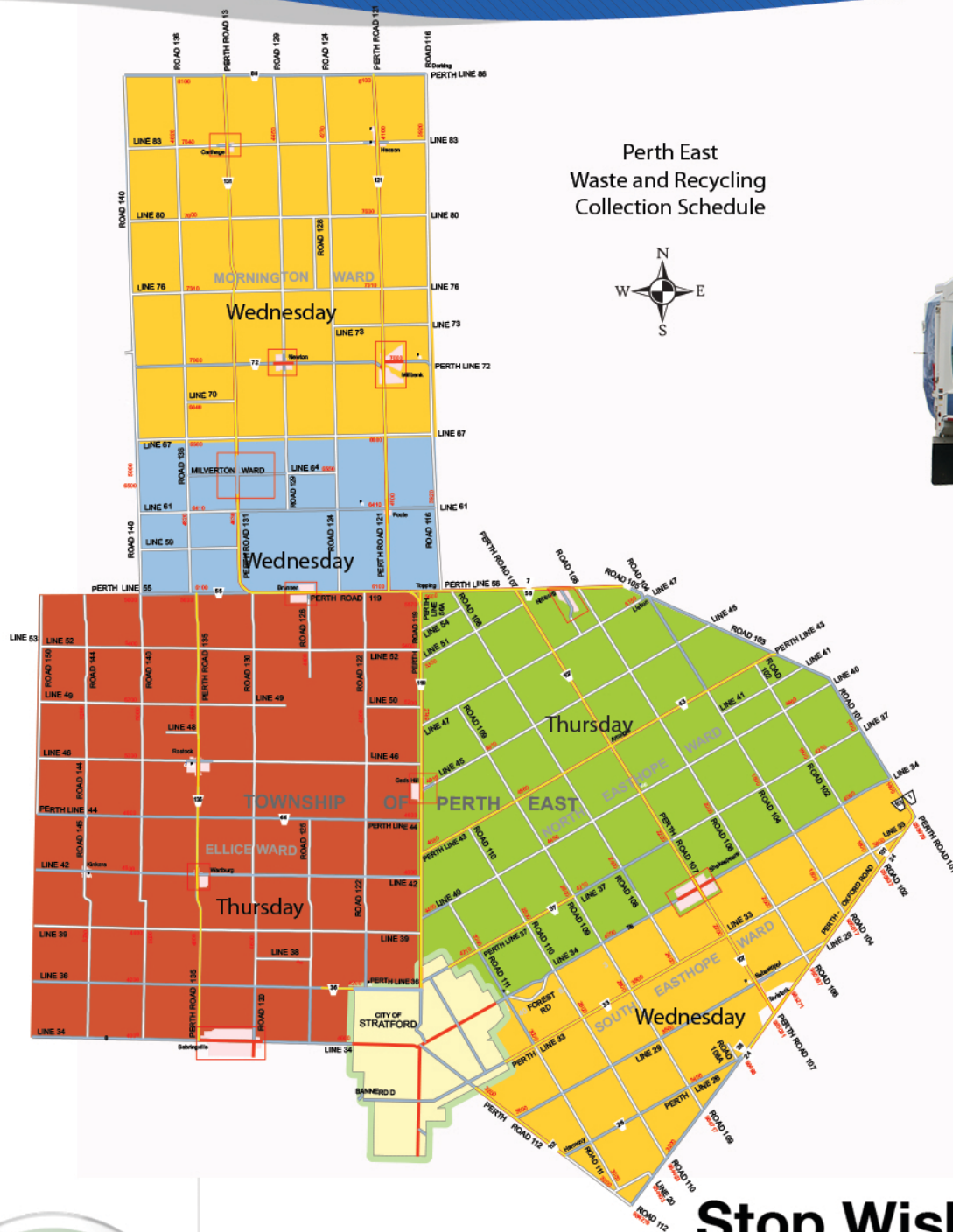

Stop Wishcycling

The items on this page are the only items we should see in your recycling bin. Many households “wishcycle” when they put something in the recycling bin without knowing if it's actually recyclable. People believe that most items can be recycled (which simply isn't true). Placing the wrong items in the recycling bins increases the cost of the program, lowers the value of the remaining recyclables, and affects the safety of our employees. Just because something is made of paper, metal, plastic, or glass, does not mean it is recyclable even if it has the recycling symbol on it.
