#### Household Garbage Collection

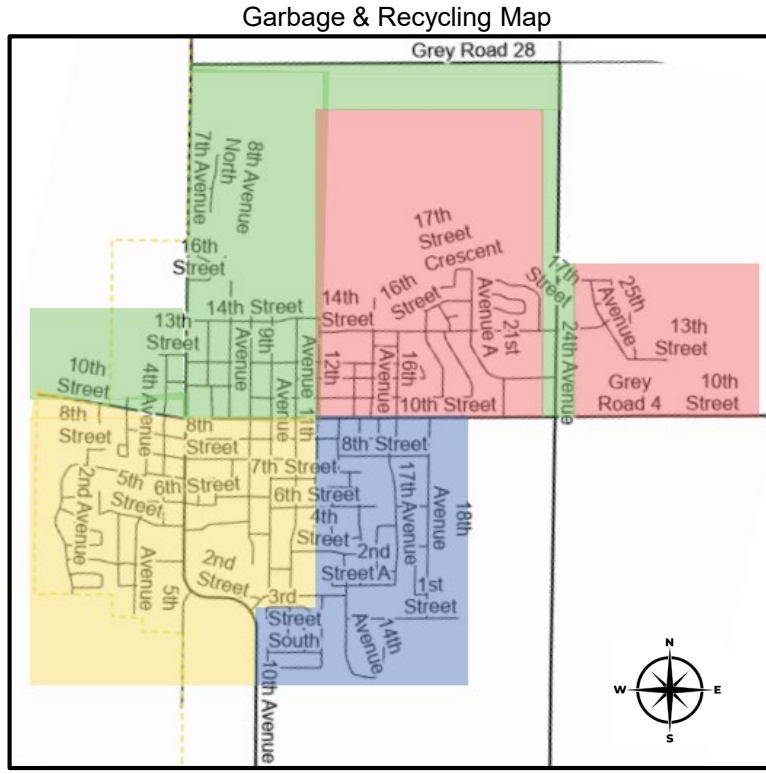
Weekly curbside household garbage collection is available to all residential dwellings (with not more than five units). Collection is provided on the following schedule:

North of 10th Street, including the north side of 10th Street			Every Thursday
South of 10th Street, including the south side of 10th Street			Every Friday

#### Recycling and Cardboard Collection

Bi-weekly curbside recycling and cardboard collection is provided to all residential, commercial and institutional properties. Collection is provided on the following schedule:

## Parking and Snow Removal

The Town of Hanover Traffic By-Law No. 3068-19 has the following two sections under which violations will be enforced by the Hanover Police Service and By-law Enforcement Officer:

- It is an offence to park a vehicle on any roadway anytime when such vehicle will interfere with snow removal operations.
- It is an offence to park a vehicle on any roadway between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of December, January, February and March.

## Fire Hydrants

With winter upon us, our Hanover Fire Department asks that residents with hydrants on their property assist in keeping them free of snow and ice accumulations.

When shoveling, plowing or snow blowing your drive, please ensure that you are not covering the hydrant.

Hydrants play a very important part in fire fighting and accessibility to each hydrant is imperative.

## Snow Plowing

During a snow storm with snow accumulations of 8 cm or greater, roads are plowed in the following order:

1. Routes to main access roads/industries
2. Routes to schools
3. Remainder of streets and cul-de-sacs

Weather and road conditions are monitored by Public Works after-hours on-call personnel. Roads and sidewalks are cleared based on provincial maintenance standards. Each snow plow is assigned a designated area of the Town and clearing is carried out on the basis of the above priorities. ## Christmas Tree Disposal

Christmas trees can be dropped off free of charge at the Hanover Park entrance located at 744 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue (west side) until January 5, 2024 or at the Hanover/Walkerton Landfill site during regular business hours.

Trees will not be collected curbside.

## Dog & Cat Tags

Dog and cat tags must always be worn. A tag is the best form of identification for your dog or cat. It will help with returning lost animals to their owners. If your animal is picked up without a licence tag you may be subject to additional fees.

Dogs over three months old must be registered and licensed annually. Licences expire on December 31<sup>st</sup> each year. Registered dog owners are invoiced in January as per the current Rates & Fees By-Law.

Cats over eight months old are required to be registered and licensed once in their lifetime.

Visit the Municipal Office at 341 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Hanover to register your dog and/or cat and receive your permanent tag. Application forms can be printed at [hanover.ca/permits-licenses-applications](http://hanover.ca/permits-licenses-applications).

The Hanover/Walkerton Waste Management Committee provides a yearly hazardous waste day event in the fall.



### Let's Recycle

**These items can be placed in your recycle bins for bi-weekly collection:**

- Plastic bottles and containers
- Glass bottles and containers
- Food & beverage cans
- Paper
- Flattened cardboard & paperboard

**These items can be taken to the landfill:**

- E-waste (computers, monitors, televisions, printing devices, etc.)
- Compost (grass clippings, leaves, brush 2" or less in diameter)
- Film plastics (must be empty, clean and dry)
- Polystyrene foam/Styrofoam with a  #6 symbol (must be empty, clean and dry)
