Bulk Item Collection Program

There are guidelines for how bulk items are collected at the curb:

- Bulk items are collected four times a year.
- Bulk item collection requests must be made at least 7 days in advance:
 - Use the Recycle Coach App
 - Use Recycle Coach online at www.chatham-kent.ca/garbage
 - By phone at 311 or 519-360-1998
- Place out by 7:00 am, but no earlier than 7:00 pm the night before collection.
- Each residential unit may set out **up to 3 bulk items per collection.** Multi-residential properties (6 or more units) may set out up to 15 items per collection.
- Bulk items may also be taken to the Harwich or Wallaceburg Waste Depot (fees apply).

Unacceptable **bulk items include**:

- E-waste
- Appliances
- Renovation materials
- Tires
- Items made mostly of metal
- Items which pose a health or safety concern for collectors
- Overly heavy items that cannot be safely picked up by two collectors.

Bulk Item Collection Dates



Respect your neighbours - please contain all waste going into your garbage cart!

All waste must be secure in bags or boxes when placed inside the garbage cart to prevent littering your neighbourhood

Your garbage cart:

Waste Connections is committed to providing the safest, most environmentally responsible and efficient waste collection services for our municipal customers in Chatham-Kent.

The automated waste collection service provides added convenience for residents, minimizes litter on local streets, and reduces safety risks posed to both drivers and residents by distracted drivers during the waste collection process.



How to use your garbage cart:

On your waste collection day, simply place your garbage cart at the curb or edge of pavement (not on sidewalk) and follow the instructions below:

- Place garbage in tied bags or closed boxes only
- The garbage cart lid must be able to close
- Overloaded garbage carts will not be emptied
- Arrow on top of lid points to the centre of the road
- Garbage carts are placed 1 metre (3 feet) from all stationary objects including other garbage carts

Do's

Put your garbage, recyclables, and scheduled bulk items at the curb by 7:00 am, but no earlier than 7:00 pm the night before collection.

Put out **one garbage container** each week. Use an acceptable garbage container (e.g. garbage cart).

Bulk items are collected four times a year and require booking at least 7 days in advance, through the Recycle Coach App, online at www.chatham-kent.ca/garbage, or by calling 311 (see page 1).

Dog feces/cat litter must be double bagged, liquid free and placed inside an acceptable container.

Deliver hazardous waste to a Household Hazardous Waste Day event or visit the Product Care website (www.productcare.org) for the nearest return to vendor location (see pages 12 or 18).

Leave grass clippings on your lawn, shred or compost leaves or **deliver yard waste to a Leaf & Yard Depot** (see page 13).

Don'ts

- **Overflowing carts, unacceptable containers, and loose garbage will not be collected.** Do not place loose household garbage in your garbage cart.
- **X** Don't place recyclable food, beverage & liquid containers out in clear/transparent bags. Place these items out loose inside your Blue Box.
- X Don't place **small grocery or kitchen catcher bags, or other loose items** at the curb. Garbage will not be picked up unless placed in an acceptable garbage container.
- These materials will not be collected: E-Waste, tires, hazardous waste, (including waste oil and antifreeze containers), scrap metal (propane tanks, barbeques, water heaters, etc.), construction & renovation materials (drywall, wood, shingles, etc.), motor oil, batteries, refrigerant units (fridges, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers), appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, microwaves, etc.) and pallets. For disposal and recycling options, check the waste depot information on page 7.
- X Don't place garbage, recycling, or bulk items at the curbside earlier than 7:00 pm the night before collection.
- X Don't place any part of needles/syringes in the garbage or recycling. Contact a local pharmacy for safe disposal options (www.healthsteward.ca) or bring them to a Household Hazardous Waste Day event.
- X Don't bring your garbage or blue box recyclables to a municipal drop-off depot. Refer to page 7 for information about the use of waste depots for excess garbage, bulk items, and some divertable materials.

Missed Collections

Missed Garbage Collection?

This could be why:

- Garbage placed in a non-prescribed container
- Garbage cart lid is not closed flat as required
- Garbage was not set out at the curb by 7:00 am
- Over the prescribed limit
- Garbage hidden (e.g. behind snow bank, parked vehicles, etc.)
- Garbage or cart not accessible (e.g. behind snow bank, too close to other objects, etc.)
- Items not accepted for curbside pickup (e.g. E-waste, tires, appliances, scrap metal, etc.)
- Large/bulk items are collected quarterly and require booking 7 days in advance (see page 1)

Missed Recycling Collection?

This could be why:

- Recycling boxes hidden behind snow bank or not set out by 7:00 am
- Non-recyclable items in the recycling boxes
- Incorrectly sorted materials
- Weighs more than 18 kg (40 lbs)
- · Cardboard is too large, not bundled, or in a non-prescribed container

Is Your Garbage and Recycling Safe for Collection?

It is your responsibility to ensure that your garbage and recycling is safe in order to be picked up.

- Put glass items, broken glass, or sharp objects (e.g. knives) in a sealed and clearly labelled cardboard box and place within your garbage cart.
- DO NOT put any needles/syringes in the garbage or recycling. Contact your local pharmacy for safe disposal options (visit www.healthsteward.ca) or bring them to a Household Hazardous Waste Day event.

Leaf & Yard Depots

All residents are allowed 2 cubic metres (approximately 25 bags) of leaf and yard waste free of charge each operating day.

New: Yard Waste in paper bags may be left at Depot, plastic bags must be emptied on site.

We Accept

Brush, leaves, grass clippings, yard waste, and natural wood no greater than 76 cm (30") in diameter and 1.5 m (5') in length are accepted.

Please do not use wire or plastic to tie bundles.

Christmas trees are accepted however no decorations or plastic tree bags please.





These items are **NOT** accepted at Leaf & Yard Sites:



Garbage, kitchen scraps, other organics, rocks, dirt, sod, tree stumps or larger branches (> 30" in dia.), flower pots/ trays, painted or treated wood, railroad ties, and animal droppings/manure.

Grasscycling: Your lawn will love it!

Leaving grass clippings on your lawn returns much-needed moisture and nutrients to the soil. Cut properly, clippings are virtually unnoticeable and generally disappear within three days.

Did you know it is a littering by-law violation to put grass in waterways and streets?

Studies show that grasscycling can reduce fertilizer requirements by as much as 30%.

It helps the soil retain valuable moisture, and helps to choke out weeds by denying light and air to them and improving your lawn's weed resistance.

Tips for successful grasscycling:

- Set your mower height to 2.5 inches (6 cm).
- Keep your mower blade(s) sharp.
- Take care to cut no more than one-third of the grass blade height at a time.
- Mow frequently to produce small clippings which will decompose faster.
- Mow when the lawn is dry to prevent clumping.

Home Composting

Composting transforms food scraps and yard waste into nutrient-rich soil, helping to reduce landfill waste and greenhouse gases.

Here's how to get started:

- For a healthy compost mix, combine a mix of "greens" (e.g. fruit/vegetable scraps) and "browns" (e.g. dry leaves, paper).
- Maintain aeration by turning the pile regularly.
- Keep out meat, dairy, and oily foods to prevent odours and pests.
- Apply finished compost on lawns or gardens to improve soil health.

By composting at home, residents can turn organic waste into a valuable resource, reducing their environmental footprint and contributing to a more sustainable community.

Recycling Guide Inside Back Cover

2-STREAM Recycling Guide



2-STREAM recycling means you separate paper products from all other recyclables. Use two containers, black box for fibres (e.g. beverage cartons, paper & boxboard) and blue box for all other acceptable recyclables. Place all shredded paper and excess paper (excluding boxboard/cardboard/cartons) in a paper or clear plastic bag in or beside your black recycling box.

STREAM 1 Fibre Products In Black Box ONLY



STREAM 2 Food, Beverage & Liquid Containers In Blue Box ONLY



Paper Beverage Cartons: includes milk, juice & Tetra Pak cartons, drink boxes, paper hot beverage paper cups. DO NOT recycle foil pouches (i.e. Koolaid

Jammers), aluminum foil lined containers (e.g. Boost, wine), etc.



Glass Bottles and Jars: Please remove food and rinse.

DO NOT recycle broken glass, drinking glasses, dishes, cups, other ceramics, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, pottery, glass pots & pans, alcoholic beverage containers.



Household Paper/Newspaper:

includes mail, white & coloured paper, envelopes, glossy publications, inserts/flyers.



DO NOT recycle waxed, foil, hard and soft cover books, laminated or gift wrap paper, or fast food waxed soft drink cups.



Aluminum/Steel Cans Plus Empty Aerosol/Paint Cans: Please remove food and rinse.

DO NOT recycle coat hangers, pots, needles, batteries, hazardous waste, alcoholic containers.



Aluminum Foil Containers and Foil:

Pie plates, trays/baking pans and take-out food containers. Please remove/rinse food and flatten.



Paper Egg Cartons and Boxboard:

such as cereal, tissue, detergent, cracker and shoe boxes. Remove liners and flatten.

* Deliver paper egg cartons to a Transfer Station to be re-used.

Cardboard Boxes:



Break down, flatten and tie in bundles no larger than 75cm x 75cm x 20cm (30"x30"x8") and place beside black box. **Do not put broken down cardboard in a cardboard box**.

Please remove food residue and liners from pizza boxes.



Plastic Bottles, Jugs and Tubs:

Now accepting more plastic household rigid containers and tubs with numbers \triangle through \triangle on the bottom of the container, including clamshells and cleaning product containers.

DO NOT recycle toys, Styrofoam[™], plastic wrap and bags, flowertrays, K-cups (Keurig, etc.), used oil containers, and unmarked plastics.
