Why Wasn't My Waste Collected?



Additional bags without a bag tag.

Any additional bags over the one bag limit per household require a \$3 bag tag to be collected.

Late placement.

Waste and large items must be placed at the curb prior to 7:00am on collection day only.

Bag was oversize or overweight.

The maximum size of a garbage bag is 26×36 inches and it must weigh less than 22.6 kilograms or 50 pounds.

Unacceptable materials.

Garbage in the recycling or unacceptable items at the curb (appliances, barbeques, electronics, construction waste, hazardous waste, tree branches, etc.)

Recycling placed in a plastic bag.

Recycling must be placed in a bin.

Collection schedule delays.

Due to a holiday or unforeseen circumstance. Check the RecycleCoach App and City Facebook Page for updates.

Throw trash away responsibly.

Garbage & Recycling Collection Requirements

Garbage Collection Requirements

- Waste and large items must be placed at the curb prior to 7:00 am on the day of collection only.
- Garbage bags and cans must weigh less than 22.6 kilograms or 50 pounds to be collected.
- Residents are allowed one bag of garbage (maximum 26 inches x 36 inches) per household per week.
- Any additional bags must each have a \$3 bag tag attached to be collected.
- Large items must have a \$10 large item tag attached to be collected.
- If you need an exemption from bag limits for medical reasons, send us an email.
- If your waste was not collected, a red sticker indicating why will be placed on it.
- There may be a delay between your regular waste and your large item being collected.
- Please ensure that your garbage is secure from wind and pests as much as
 possible. This includes avoiding early set outs and using a can with a removable
 lid, if necessary.

Bag Tags and Large Item Tags

When you want to place more bags than the permitted limit, you must attach a green bag tag. Green bag tags are sold individually for \$3.

When you want to dispose of a large item (such as couches, dressers, chairs, mattresses, box springs, tables, etc.) you must attach an Orange Large Item Tag. Please check "What Goes Where?" on the Recycle Coach App to see if your large item is acceptable for collection. Orange Large Item Tags are sold individually for \$10.

Recycling Collection Requirements

- Recycling must be placed at the curb prior to 7:00 am on the day of collection only.
- Recycling must be placed in a bin, not a plastic bag. Recycling placed at the curb in plastic bags will not be collected.
- There is no limit to the amount of recycling you can set out.
- Recycling can be co-mingled, meaning all plastics, metal, glass, and paper products can be placed together in the same recycling bin.
- Please ensure materials are clean.
- If garbage is found in the recycling it will be refused.
- Corrugated cardboard must be cut and folded into bundles with dimensions less than 76 centimetres (30 inches) in any direction.
- If your recycling wasn't collected a red sticker indicating why will be placed on it.
- If you're unsure about an item, check "What Goes Where?" on the RecycleCoach
 App to see what is acceptable for recycling collection.

What Can be Recycled

Recycling must be placed in a bin, not a plastic bag. Recycling can be CO-MINGLED, meaning all plastics/metal/glass AND paper products can be placed together in the same recycling bin - no additional sorting required. Please ensure material is clean. If garbage is found in recycling it will be refused. Check the City's Free Recycle Coach App on the App Store and see "What Goes Where".

Recyclable



- Empty plastic containers, including plastics #1-7
- ✓ Glass containers
- Steel and aluminum cans, containers, pans and clean foil
- Empty & dry paint cans, aerosol cans with lids off and jar lids
- Newspaper, flyers, magazines and catalogues
- ✓ Soft cover books, paper and clean
- ✓ Food & Beverage Cartons (Milk,) juice, broth, soup etc.)
- Corrugated cardboard (Must be folded/cut into bundles less than 30 inches (76 cm) in any dimension)

Not Recyclable



- Styrofoam
- Ceramics
- Film plastic (bags, shrink wrap)
- Windows and tempered glass
- Toys (donate)
- Footwear & clothing (donate)
- Pots/pans (donate)
- Oversized plastic pails, buckets, laundry baskets
- Products with mixed materials
- Chip bags
- X Broken glass (securely place in a box, tape up, and place beside your garbage bag with a note saying "Broken Glass")
- X Soiled cardboard (pizza boxes, coffee cups, take out boxes)

Items Not Accepted for Collection

- Appliances
- Air conditioners
- Dehumidifiers
- Auto parts
- Fuel tanks
- Pools & liners
- Hazardous waste
- Propane tanks
- Needles (please use a Sharps program)

- Electronics (computers, TVs, radios, speakers, printers, etc.)
- X Demolition, construction, and renovation materials (drywall, lumber, windows, tempered glass, doors, shingles, stones, bricks, tiles, cupboards, cabinets, toilets, etc.)
- X Large metal items (can be brought to Waste Management for free or to a scrap metal recycler)

How do I dispose of these items?

Some of these items require special disposal or may be brought to the Waste Management transfer station for a fee. Please contact beforehand. Sorted recyclable materials can be brought to Waste Management for free (see page 14 for more details about Waste Management). For information on other items listed, visit www.brockville.com.

Ontario's transition to producer responsibility

In 2021, the Ontario government released the <u>Blue Box</u>
<u>Regulation</u> that shifts the financial and operational responsibility of recycling programs to producers – those that produce and supply blue box materials to residents. In this new extended producer responsibility framework, producers become financially and operationally responsible for collecting and recycling blue box materials.

Who we are

Circular Materials is a national not-for-profit organization that builds efficient and effective recycling systems where materials are collected, recycled and returned to producers to use as recycled content in new packaging and paper. As the administrator of Ontario's common collection system, Circular Materials is responsible for operating the new system for blue box materials. We are committed to increasing recycling rates across Ontario and ensuring more materials are looped into the circular economy, benefiting both people and the environment.

What does this transition mean for residents?

Transition to the new framework will occur in a phased approach over the next two and a half years. During this time, Ontarians will not notice any differences to their recycling schedule and will still be able to recycle the same materials as before.

Transition timeline

Transition to extended producer responsibility will take place between 2023 – 2025, with the new framework fully in place on January 1, 2026. Along with the Regulation, the government released a schedule that assigns each of the 376 Ontario communities a transition date.

Why the transition is important



- Historically, Ontario's blue box programs were operated by municipalities who shared the costs with producers. Now, under the Blue Box Regulation, Ontario is transitioning to a new model where producers are fully responsible for operating and funding the entire blue box program.
- In 2026, Ontario can expect a convenient, consistent, and
 effective recycling system in place that will improve recycling
 rates. This includes a consistent list of recyclable materials
 across the province.
- This new system operated by Circular Materials represents the evolution from product stewardship to a more circular economy where materials are collected, recycled and used again as recycled content in new packaging and products.

What does extended producer responsibility (EPR) mean?

EPR is a framework in which producers – the businesses that supply paper and packaging to residents – are responsible for managing the end-of-life management of these materials. EPR enables innovation, operational efficiencies, increased standard levels, and access to materials. It is recognized as one of the most effective mechanisms to improve recycling rates.

Leaf & Yard Compost Site

The Leaf & Yard Compost Site accepts leaves, indoor and garden plants, small amounts of soil, brush, hedge trimmings, and tree limbs.

- Grass clippings, sod, weeds, and household organic wastes are not accepted at the compost site.
- Leaves are accepted loose or in paper leaf bags only.
- Paper leaf bags must not be taped or stapled.
- Plastic Bags are not permitted on site.
- Brush must be debagged.
- Tree limbs must be less than four (4) feet in length and less than eight (8) inches in diameter.
- Brockville residents are entitled to two (2) free wheelbarrow sized loads of compost per year. Residents are responsible for loading and transportation of small quantities of compost.

Fall Curbside Leaf Collection

Curbside collection of leaves will take place during the following weeks:

October 27th - October 31st November 17th - November 21st

- Place the leaves out for collection prior to 7:00am on your regular collection day.
- Leaves are collected in a separate vehicle and may be picked before or after garbage and recycling.
- Leaves will be collected in paper bags or reusable containers only.
- Reusable containers are to be labeled that they contain leaves.
- Leaves in plastic bags of any kind will not be collected.
- Paper leaf bags must not be taped or stapled.

Regulations & prices quoted are applicable at the time of printing and are subject to change during the calendar year. The City reserves the right to limit the type or quantities of waste accepted, or of compost given or sold.

Hazardous and Special Products (HSP)

Some items cannot be collected at the curb and must be disposed of properly. Examples of hazardous and special products include batteries, paints, motor oil, antifreeze, herbicides & pesticides, propane tanks, light bulbs, and prescription drugs, etc.

The City of Brockville hosts an annual Household Hazardous Waste Day for these items. Household Hazardous Waste Day is scheduled for Saturday August 23rd between 8:00am and 2:00pm and will be held at the Brockville Youth Arena.

Traffic will be one way. Please enter from the north on Oxford Avenue and turn right on Broadway Avenue only. Please monitor our website, facebook page, local papers and radio stations, or call for information and updates.

Use the RPRA's 'Where to Recycle' map to find locations across Ontario where you can drop off HSP materials to be recycled, such as batteries, electronics, household hazardous waste, lighting and tires, for free.

Community Treasure Days

Saturday June 14th and September 13th. The garage sale where everything is free! Leave any unwanted but still useful items at the curb by 9:00 a.m. Remove any uncollected treasures from the curb and cease collecting by 6:00 p.m. Please do not remove items from anyone's property - only collect items from the curb.

Municipal Household Hazardous Waste Day

Saturday August 23rd, from 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. at the Brockville Youth Arena. Residents of Brockville can drop off any hazardous materials generated from their individual households for free.

Fall Curbside Leaf Collections

Weeks of October 27th to 31st, and November 17th to 21st. Place leaves out for collection prior to 7:00am on your regular waste collection day in reusable containers or paper bags ONLY. Paper leaf bags must not be taped or stapled and leaves in plastic bags will not be collected.

Wintertime Garbage & Recycling Collection


The winter months can be challenging for your waste and recycling collector. Following the suggestions below can make their job easier, safer, more efficient, and will reduce late and missed collection:

- Place your waste at the end of your cleared driveway or shoveled out part of the boulevard.
- Waste should not be placed on the road or sidewalk as it creates a hazard for pedestrians and snow plow operators.
- Don't leave your waste on your front lawn, steps, against your house, on top of or behind snowbanks, away from the curb, or where it cannot be accessed by the collectors without difficulty.

Please consider that the collectors are coming from the roadside and place waste where it can easily be accessed without the collectors having to climb through snow or leave the roadside and go onto your property.
